#### Title:

Part 2 of what was originally one book: Samuel – Named after one of its chief characters.

#### Author:

Anonymous, tradition suggests possibly Jeremiah

## Occasion and Purpose:

Probably written at the end of the monarchy. It shows the monarchy at its best and at its worst. The story is told in such a way as to highlight the difference between a godly king (who leads the nation into blessing) and an ungodly king (who leads the nation into punishment). The point is that the monarchy was ended because of the influence of bad kings, when they could have been so much better.

### Summary:
