

Gal 1:1-5 mws

v. 1

ἀπόστολος

messenger with extraordinary status, of God's messenger, envoy, predominately in the NT of a group of highly honored believers with a special function as God's envoys, denoted one who proclaimed the gospel

ἀπ'

to indicate the point from which something begins, whether lit. or fig.

to indicate origin or source, from

marker of source of an implied event

δι'

marker of personal agency, through, by, 'by human agency'

marker of intermediate agent, with implicit or explicit causative agent

v. 2

ἐκκλησίαις

people with shared belief, community, congregation, of a specific Christian group

v. 3

χάρις

favor in fixed formulas at the beginning and end of letters, favor, grace, gracious care, goodwill
kindness, graciousness, grace

εἰρήνη

a state of well-being, peace, in greetings, 'grace and peace'

a set of favorable circumstances involving peace and tranquility, a state of freedom from anxiety and inner turmoil, peace, freedom from worry

v. 4

δόντος

AAPtcpMSG

fr. δίδωμι

to dedicate oneself for some purpose or cause, give up, sacrifice, give oneself

to dedicate oneself to some activity in a completely willing manner, usually implying service on behalf of someone or something, to give oneself to, to dedicate oneself to

ὅπως

marker expressing purpose for an event or state, in order that

marker of purpose for events and states, in order to, for the purpose of, so that

ἐξέλθῃται

AMS3sg

fr. ἐξαίρω

to deliver someone from peril or confining circumstances, set free, deliver, rescue

to rescue or set something free from danger, to set free, to deliver

ἐνεστῶτος

PfAPtcpMSG

fr. εἰς τὴν μ

to be present as condition or thing at the time of speaking, be now, happen now, the present time, the present age

to be simultaneous with the time of the discourse, present, to be present

πονηροῦ

pertaining to being morally or socially worthless, wicked, evil, bad, base, worthless, vicious, degenerate, in the judgment of Christians a close connection with sin is the chief characteristic of this age

v. 5

δόξα

honor as enhancement or recognition of status or performance, fame, recognition, renown, honor, prestige

to speak of something as being unusually fine and deserving honor, to praise, to glorify, praise
