Title:

Joshua- named after its main character

Author:

Anonymous, tradition suggests possibly Joshua, Samuel

Occasion and Purpose:

Possibly written during the time of the judges to tell the story of the conquest- highlighting God's provision of victory when Israel was faithful and God's punishment when Israel was unfaithful. This would serve as a warning for those struggling to conquer their enemies because of their unfaithfulness. This would also serve as encouragement because God is faithful to fulfill **all** of His promises.

Themes:

1. Transition of Leadership
2. Holy War
3. Inheritance
4. God's promises fulfilled

Summary:

The account of how the Israelites finally entered and conquered the promised land. The inhabitants were all overthrown with the miraculous help of God and the leadership of Joshua. Then the land (which is seen as a gracious gift from God as Israel's inheritance) is divided up among the people.
