δυναμένω PM/PdepPtcpMSD fr. δυναμαι
to possess capability (whether because of personal or external factors) for experiencing or doing something, can, am able, be capable
to be able to do or to experience something, can, to be able to

φυλάξει AAInf fr. φυλασσω
to protect by taking careful measures, guard, protect
to hold someone in close custody, to guard closely

ἀπταίστους
without stumbling, 'keep you from stumbling'
pertaining to not having failed to keep the law (of God), free from stumbling, free from sinning,
'to him who is able to keep you free from sinning'

στησαι AAInf fr. ἵστημι
to cause to be in a place or position, set, place, bring, allow to come
to cause to be in a place, with or without the accompanying feature of standing position, to put,
to place, to set, to make stand, to be there

κατενώπιον
marker of a position in front of, right, opposite, 'in the presence of God on the day of judgment'
a position in front of an object, whether animate or inanimate, which is regarded as having a special orientation of front and back, in front of, before

δόξης
the condition of being bright or shining, brightness, splendor, radiance, the concept has been widened to denote the glory, majesty, sublimity of God in general
the state of brightness or shining, brightness, shining, radiance

ἀμώμους
pertaining to being without fault and therefore morally blameless, blameless
pertaining to being without fault and hence morally blameless, blameless, without fault, faultless, perfect

ἀγαλλιάσει
a piercing exclamation, exultation, 'full of exultation, joy'
a state of intensive joy and gladness, often implying verbal expression and body movement, to be extremely joyful, to rejoice greatly, extreme gladness

μόνω

pertaining to being the only entity in a class, only, alone, 'the only God' cf. 1 Tim 1:17
the only entity in a class, only one, alone

σωτήρι

one who rescues, savior, deliverer, preserver, as a title of God, cf. 1 Tim. 1:1, 2:3
one who saves, Savior

δόξα

honor as enhancement or recognition of status or performance, fame, recognition, renown, honor, prestige
to speak of something as being unusually fine and deserving honor, to praise, to glorify, praise

μεγαλωσύνη

a state of greatness or preeminence, majesty, used only of God in a doxology with δόξα
a state of greatness or importance, prominence, greatness, importance, to the only God...glory, prominence, might

κράτος

exercise of ruling ability, power, rule, sovereignty, in a doxology
the power to rule or control, power, might

ἐξουσία

potential or resource to command, control, or govern, capability, might, power
the power to do something, with or without an added implication of authority, power

πρὸ

marker of a point of time prior to another point of time, earlier than, before
idiom, an exceedingly long period of time from an assumed beginning up to the present, since all time, from all ages past, from the beginning of time, 'to God...be the authority since all ages past'

αἰῶνος

a long period of time, without reference to beginning or end, of time gone by, the past, earliest times, 'before time began'
idiom, an exceedingly long period of time from an assumed beginning up to the present, since all time, from all ages past, from the beginning of time, 'to God...be the authority since all ages past'

ἀμήν

strong affirmation of what is stated, as expression of faith, let it be so, truly, amen, at the end of a doxology, cf. 1 Pet 4:11, 5:11
strong affirmation of what is declared, truly, indeed, it is true that
