v. 36

They took Him along in the boat

Leaving the crowds,
as He was,
and other boats were with Him

v. 37


And there became a great storm of wind

[cf. Psa. 107:23ff.]

And the waves threw upon the boat


Additional Notes:

v. 38

And He was in the stern sleeping on a pillow




And they woke Him

He rebuked the wind and said to the sea [Psa. 89:9]

And getting up [cf. Sirach 36:8, Psa. 44:23, 78:65]

Be silent [cf. Mk. Exorcism language]
Be still/quiet

[often Jesus first teaches- teachable moment- before miracle, not so here]

And the wind died down and it became a *great* calm

v. 40

And He said to them

Why are you so cowardly?
Do you not yet have faith?

[cf. 4:13 they should know by now, cf. 8:17,21]

v. 41

And they feared a *great* fear

Therefore and they said toward one another

Who is this?
That the wind and the waves obey Him?
