law, Mosaic law code, rules & commands spoken of in personal terms – is active, etc.

άμαρτία

sin, every departure from the way of righteousness, to act contrary to the will and law of God

ἔγνων AAI1pl fr. γινωσκω

know, come to know, understand, comprehend, to come to an understanding as the result of ability to experience and learn – to come to understand, to perceive, to comprehend, "I wouldn't have understood sin without the help of the law."

ήδειν PlPfAI1sg fr. οιδα

know, come to know, understand, comprehend

έπιθυμήσεις. FAI2sg fr. επιθυμεω

to have a strong desire to do or secure something, to desire, to long for

ἀφορμὴν

occasion, pretext, opportunity, favorable circumstances, opportunity, occasion, "grasp an opportunity"

έπιθυμίαν

desire, longing – in bad sense desire for something forbidden, covet, to greatly desire to have or do something, covet, lust, evil desire

έντολῆς

mandate or ordinance, command, commandments of the OT law, the sg. takes in all the commandments as the law, that which is authoritatively commanded

κατειργάσατο AdepI3sg fr. κατεργαζομαι

bring about, produce, create, to cause a state to be, to result in

νεκρά

dead, fig. of things – "without law, sin is dead, is not perceptible" – unable to respond or perform

ἔζων IAI1sg fr. ζαω

live, in the supernatural life of the child of God

ἀνέζησεν AAI3sg fr. αναζαω

come to life again, spring into life, begin to function

v.10

εύρέθη API3sg fr. εύρισκω

find, fig. of intellectual discovery based upon reflection, observation, discover, begin to experience, "the command proved to be death"

v.11

έξηπάτησέν AAI3sg fr. εξαπαταω

deceive, cheat, lead astray, to cause someone to have misleading or erroneous views concerning the truth, to mislead

v.12

άγία

being dedicated or consecrated to the service of God, holy, pure, perfect, worthy of God, possessing superior moral qualities and essentially divine qualities in contrast with what is human

δικαία

being in accordance with high standards of rectitude, upright, just, fair, right, righteous, in accordance with what God desires

άγαθή.

meeting a high standard of worth and merit, good, that which is beneficial or helpful
