

# OT212 Psalms Final Exam Study Guide

The Final Exam will consist of 4 parts

1. **Scripture reading**- You will simply report the approximate percentage of assigned Scripture reading you have completed as of the time of the exam.
2. **Scripture memorization**- You will write from memory the verses you have chosen to memorize
3. **Psalms**- You will be tested on your knowledge of the Psalms we have covered in class (they are listed below with their appropriate categories). This may include the organization and development (outline) of the Psalms, those items highlighted in class, and the application of each Psalm.
4. **Psalm Types**- You will be tested on your knowledge of the various categories of Psalms we have covered in class. This may include the formal features, the characteristic features, the life situations, and the contemporary applications including prayer.

The following types have been covered in class:

- a. Wisdom introduction: Psalms 1, 2
- b. Laments: Psalms 42-3, 56, 22
- c. Penitential/Confession: Psalms 51, 32
- d. Thanksgiving Psalms: Psalms 30, 116
- e. Salvation Historical Psalms: Psalm 78
- f. Wisdom Psalms: Psalms 73, 111
- g. Psalms of Trust: Psalms 23, 121, 131
- h. Royal Psalms: Psalm 110
- i. Psalms of Guidance/Prayer: Psalm 25
- j. Hymns/Praise Psalms: 95, 96, 150

The Final Exam will be a combination of True/False, Matching, Multiple choice, Short answer/Fill in the blank and short essay type questions.
